EVENT DETAILS

1. Round 1 of AMA QLD Interclub Series will be conducted by the Logan River Motorcycle Trials Club (LRMTC) at Hinchcliff's Property
2. LICENCE REQUIREMENT
 - a. The event will be held in accordance with the current AMA General Competition Rules and Event information found on this page. All riders must have a current AMA Class D Licence or higher or alternately an AMA one Event Licence which can be purchased at event.
3. ENTRIES
 - a. Entries are open from receipt of these Event Details.
 - b. Entry to be made online at <https://trialsport.com.au/entries/> Select state and event.
 - c. Payment to be made on the event day preferably with correct event entry fee.
4. INSURANCE
 - a. AMA Insurance providers ensure basic cover for death and permanent disability
 - b. Ambulance insurance is compulsory for each competitor
 - c. Income protection insurance is strongly recommended for all competitors.
5. FIRST AID
 - a. First Aid providers will be in attendance during the event.
 - b. Injury's incurred during the event must be reported to the event organiser/Referee's

7. EVENT PROGRAM	Time
a. Gates open at	7.00 am
b. Rider Sign on and score card issue	7.30am – 8.00am
c. Observer Briefing	8.30am – 8.45am
d. Bikes in Parc Ferme	8.00am – 8.45am
e. Rider Briefing	8.45am - 9.00am
f. Start of Competition	9.00am
g. End of Competition	2.30pm

All entrants will be able to inspect all sections on foot up until rider briefing. All entrants must be present for rider briefing.

8. Awards

- a. Medallions will be presented 1st, 2nd & 3rd place getters in each competing class.
- b. Medallions will be presented after competition scores are collated at end of competition.

9. Machine safety

- a. All machines entered must comply with the AMA General Competition Rules
- b. It is the entrant/parents responsibility to ensure the acknowledgement of risk of motor vehicle use and the participant terms and conditions have been read and understood prior to signing entry form. Any machine suffering accidental damage during the event and is repaired meets the AMA General Competition Rules.
- c. Properly secured helmets must be worn by all competitors and referees using any motorcycle, trike or quad. Competitors shall have lanyards secured at all times.

10. RIDERS BRIEFING

- a. It is compulsory for all entrants, parents & legal guardians of Junior and under 18 year old entrants to attend rider briefings.
- b. Referees may prevent any rider from starting the event if not present at the rider briefing.
- c. Smoking is prohibited at riders briefing.

11. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

- a. Use of drugs and or alcohol shall be prohibited during event by participants. Doing so will be in breach of Code of Conduct and offenders will be required to leave event.

12. CODES OF CONDUCT and BEHAVIOUR

- a. Participant terms and conditions shall be adhered to at all times, failure to do so will result in immediate exclusion from event and possible removal from the venue.

13. SECTION AND LAP DISCRIPTION

- a. A section loop of 8 sections per class.
- b. Number of loops per day to be confirmed at riders briefing.

14. SPECTATOR FEE AND INFORMATION

- a. Spectators are welcome and entry is free.

15. SPECIAL NOTES

Dogs are not allowed at event with the exception of guide dogs.

16. GENERAL NOTES

Free Sausage Sizzle is available at presentation for all attendees.

Bring own drinking water and food.

Toilets available at event.

Camping is permitted Saturday night. Gates Open midday Saturday of event.

There will be 5 rounds in total with rounds 4 & 5 being run consecutively on the same weekend in September by CQTC. Riders will score points at each round, based on their finishing position. Points will accumulate over the 5 rounds, however the series score will be determined over 4 rounds, meaning a rider who competes in all 5 rounds can elect to drop his worst round score. A minimum number of rounds is not required for qualification in this series.
